Learning about Riparian Health

The Cows and Fish program offers training about riparian areas, riparian and grazing management and riparian health. We work with a wide range of audiences and provide information at a variety of levels. In addition to presentations, we provide opportunities for landowners, resource managers and the general public to better understand the health and functioning of riparian areas - the green zones adjacent to streams, rivers, lakes and wetlands. We aim to custom fit field and training activities to your needs and knowledge level. Understanding riparian health is one tool that allows us to "tune our eyes", appreciate the key pieces of the riparian area and evaluate what we see.



Why is Training Important?

Riparian health training offers many benefits, including:

- ◆ Creating general awareness about riparian areas and how to recognize and measure riparian health.
- ◆ Helping landowners and others to understand and use information collected in Riparian Health Inventories or Assessments in order to make management decisions either individually or as a group.
- ◆ Providing hands-on learning around riparian area health.
- ◆ For those keen to use the methods themselves, such as landowners or resource management professionals, it creates greater consistency and accuracy in both applying Riparian Health Assessments and interpreting their results.

Would you like to better understand the health of your riparian area? If so, a **Riparian Awareness** presentation or a **Field Day** may be for you.

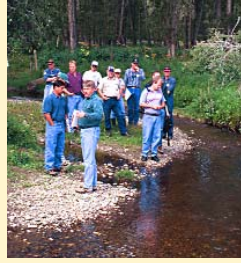
Are you interested in collecting some information to help you better understand and recognize riparian health? If so, training in **Riparian Health Assessments** could be just what you are looking for.

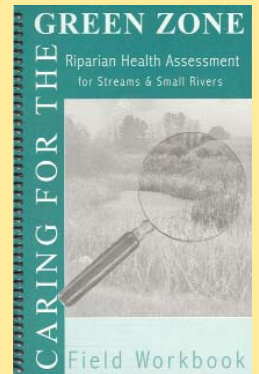


Riparian Health Assessments

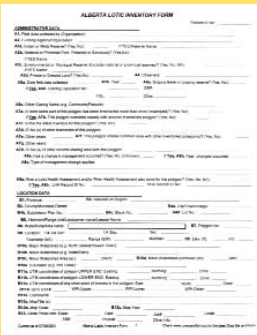
How Long? 1 - 2 days
